On Wednesday evening, both the Men's and Women's Wrestling Teams wrestled for Gold in the Team Finals. The men's team beat Team Alberta 28-17 to win **GOLD**. Out of 11 wrestlers, 6 won their matches to assist Team Saskatchewan.

The women's team lost a barn burner to Team BC 22-23. Five out of the 10 Team Saskatchewan women's team won their matches to win the **SILVER** medal. On Thursday morning, 20 of the 21 wrestlers will be in the semi finals for the individual wrestling event – all going for gold!



Men's V'Ballers Hard at it

In their first match on Wednesday, the Mens Volleyball team defeated a feisty New Brunswick squad 3-0 (25-23; 25-16; 25-18). Leading the way was Alwyn Piche of La Loche with 13 kills, 6 digs & 1 service ace; Brian Loden of Weyburn with 8 kills & 1 service ace; and Gavin Schmitt of Saskatoon adding another 8 kills.

In their second match of the day, the team played against Alberta and defeated them 3:1 (25-21; 25-23; 14-25; 25-19) in front of a packed house at the volleyball venue. Fans were on the edge of their seats as both teams had spectacular digs and thunderous spikes. Alwyn Piche was a threat on the outside with 17 kills, 3 digs and 2 service aces; in the middle Gavin Schmitt led the way with 9 kills, 1 dig and 1 block. Team Sask. had some stellar defence from libero Dan Quintal of Saskatoon with 10 digs.
