Breaking a provincial Junior record was Morgan Bolen in the Women's 800 Meters. She placed 5th overall.

The men's 4 x 100 meter relay team has been reinstated after Saskatchewan's protest was upheld by the jury committee. They will be running a timed final on Friday. Brienne Theisen and Janine Polischuk are first and second, respectively after the first day of the heptathlon. Depending on the outcome of a protest by Quebec, the woman's 10 000 meter race, Jayne Grebinski will finish 4th or 5th while Dakota MacQuarrie will be 11th or 12th. Matt Scobie lost his silver medal after being disqualified in the men's 800 meter final. He was awarded 8th place after the decision. Team Sask sits in third place in the women's side with a total of 2333 pts and fourth place in the men's side with a total of 2149 pts heading into the final day of competition.
