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## National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) / Competency Based Education and Training (CBET)

What is the NCCP?

The NCCP is the recognized national standard for coach training and certification in Canada. In the past, coaches achieved certification by completing level 1, 2, and 3 by finishing the three components required for each level (theory, technical and practical). The final levels 4 and 5 were achieved by completing a number of tasks.

The new NCCP has evolved into Competency Based Education and Training (CBET) approach in which coaches achieve certification within a specific stream and context. The Canadian Amateur Wrestling Association (CAWA) is currently working in partnership with the NCCP to develop the new wrestling specific certification program.

### **Community Sport Stream**

The Community sport stream is focused on coaches who are working with grassroots athletes (i.e.: parents and coaches who want to coach, but may have little background in the sport and need to know the basic rules and positions of the sport as well as how to run a practice). Resources for this stream are being developed.



## Competitive Sport Stream

Of the three streams (Community, Competitive, and Instruction) the contexts for the Competitive stream are most similar to the existing NCCP Theory-Technical-Practical model. Contexts include Introduction to Competition (**similar to** Levels 1-2), Developmental Competition (**similar to** Levels 2-3), and High Performance (similar to Levels 4-5).

## Instruction Stream

The instruction stream consists of three contexts, directed at individuals who are instructing or teaching others how to wrestle.
